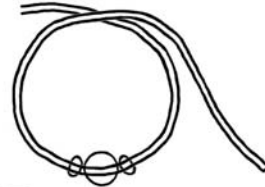


adjustable slide knot

This technique is great for thicker cords like leather or genya, with a single pendant or a few central beads. You will need a piece of cord a few inches longer than twice the length of your finished piece.

1. String on your bead(s). Cross one end over the other side, leaving a few inches to work with. Use your thumb & forefinger to hold the crossing.



2. Loop the end of the cord around the other side twice.



3. Bring the end of the cord behind and through both loops.



4. Pull both sides of that end to tighten.



5. Bring the other end of the cord around the loop that forms your piece.



6. Tie the same knot on that side. You may need to re-do this a few times to position it properly. Trim off any extra cord.



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
